Is the program more suitable for academicians or public health practitioners? Or can both apply?

> This program is designed for academicians and public health practitioners passionate about the implementation of science/research. It aims to strengthen implementation science (IS) skills to improve health outcomes while addressing four global health challenges highlighted in the TDR Strategy 2024-2025.













I noticed that one of the requirements is being employed by a university, research institution, or NGO. Currently, I am not employed but actively seeking research opportunities. Would my application still be considered?

> We understand your interest; however, priority is given to candidates currently affiliated with an eligible institution.











When does the fellowship start and what is the duration?

> The fellowship will begin in March 2025. The duration of the fellowship for the academic and research stream will be between 9 to 12 months, while the public health practitioners stream will last 6 months.















Could you share details about the curriculum and the schedule of activities during the fellowship?

> The fellowship curriculum is designed to comprehensively equip participants with the skills needed for impactful implementation science/research. It covers:

- 1. Foundational Implementation Science/Research Skills
- 2. Leadership and Management Skills
- 3. Interpersonal and Communication Skills
- 4. Personal and Professional Attributes

The schedule will include workshops, on-site projects, mentorship sessions, and dissemination activities. Details of the timeline and activities will be shared with successful applicants.















How many fellows will be selected for the program?

> The cohort size is limited to ensure quality interactions and mentoring. Exact numbers will depend on applications received and reviewed.
